CLINICAL PSYCHOLOGY (CLP)

CLP 4143 - Psychological Disorders (3 Credits)

Descriptive Psychopathology, theoretical models, empirical evaluation and treatment of maladaptive behavior.

Prerequisite(s): PSY 2012 and (PSY 3213) and (STA 2122 or PSY 3205)

CLP 4302 - Intro to Clinical Psychology (3 Credits)

Introduction to Clinical Psychology: Surveys scientific basis, training, roles, models, controversies, and ethics.

Prerequisite(s): PSY 2012 and (PSY 3213 or PSY 3017) and (STA 2122 or

PSY 3205) and CLP 4143

Attribute(s): PSYE - Psych Restric Electives

CLP 4305 - Psychotherapy (3 Credits)

An introduction to the theoretical approaches to psychotherapy and their practical applications in clinical settings. Students will examine the effects of different therapist roles and learn key concepts, applications, and techniques from most traditional therapeutic approaches in psychotherapy. Students will also become familiar with historical, current, and cultural issues in the psychotherapy profession.

Prerequisite(s): PSY 2012 and PSY 3213 and (STA 2122 or PSY 3205)

CLP 4314 - Health Psychology (3 Credits)

Review of application of clinical psychology in behavioral medicine context. Emphasis on rehabilitation and prevention.

Prerequisite(s): PSY 2012 and (PSY 3213 or PSY 3017) and (STA 2122 or PSY 3205)

Attribute(s): PSYE - Psych Restric Electives

CLP 4414 - Behavior Modification (3 Credits)

Introduction to behavior analysis and application of learning principles, behavioral assessment, single subject research designs, and interventions in treatment settings.

Prerequisite(s): PSY 2012 and (PSY 3213 or PSY 3017) and (STA 2122 or PSY 3205)

Attribute(s): PSYE - Psych Restric Electives

CLP 4420 - Human Neuropsychology (3 Credits)

Investigate assessment of cognitive processes through psychometric and behavioral measures. Techniques for assessment and differential diagnoses as well as functional neuroanatomy in a variety of intellectual, neurological, and psychiatric conditions.

Prerequisite(s): PSB 4002 (may be taken concurrently)

CLP 4433 - Psych Tests & Measurements (3 Credits)

Consideration of the theoretical issues in psychometric test development. Review of instruments for intellectual, personality and neuropsychological assessment including development, applications, and potential abuses.

Prerequisite(s): PSY 2012 and (PSY 3213 or PSY 3017) and (STA 2122 or PSY 3205)

Attribute(s): PSYE - Psych Restric Electives

CLP 4930 - Sp. Topics: Psychopathology (3 Credits)

Selected topics in abnormal psychology provides opportunities for in-depth study of topics related to abnormal psychology that are not covered in other courses.

Prerequisite(s): PSY 2012 and (PSY 3213) and (STA 2122 or PSY 3205)

CLP 4941 - Clinical Psychology Practicum (3 Credits)

This course will offer students the opportunity to work in a community mental health practice. Students will observe psychological interviews, psychological and neuropsychological assessments as well as engage in didactic training and case conceptualization.
