# **POLITICAL THEORY (POT)**

#### POT 3003 - Political Theorists (3 Credits)

Exploration of key theorists and themes in political theory; topics include citizenship; democracy, sovereignty, social justice, and the good life.

Prerequisite(s): ENC 1102

#### POT 3075 - Culture and Politics (3 Credits)

An examination of the interrelationship between culture and politics, with particular emphasis on the symbolic and material impacts of culture on policy making.

# POT 3303 - Ideology & Propaganda (3 Credits)

Examines contemporary theoretical perspectives on political ideology and propaganda, and then applies these perspectives to Fascist, State Socialist, and Democratic political systems.

# POT 3501 - Politics, Ethics, & Pol Theory (3 Credits)

Examines classical and contemporary political theory perspectives on ethical problems in politics.

#### POT 4204 - American Political Thought (3 Credits)

Survey of major writings and themes in American Political Thought.

Prerequisite(s): ENC 1102

## POT 4514 - Theories of Political Violence (3 Credits)

Examines classical and contemporary political theory perspectives on violence in politics.

Prerequisite(s): ENC 1102

# POT 4906 - Ind Study in Political Theory (3 Credits)

Independent study in political theory under faculty supervision. Instructor approval required for registration.

### POT 4932 - Sp Topics -Politics/Humanities (3 Credits)

Interdisciplinary examination of a selected topic within politics and the humanities. Topics may vary depending on instructor.
