# **PSYCHOLOGY (PSY)**

#### PSY 2012 - General Psychology (3 Credits)

In this course, students will gain an introduction to the scientific study of human behavior and mental processes. Topics may be drawn from historical and current perspectives in psychology.

Attribute(s): CRIT - GE Critical Think Competency, GE Critical Think Competency, GESO - Gen. Ed -Social Science, Gen. Ed -Social Science, SCIQ - Scientific Inquiry, Scientific Inquiry

#### PSY 2023 - Careers in Psychology (1 Credits)

This course helps prepare students to succeed in the psychology major and plan for their professional life beyond earning a degree in psychology. Topics that are covered include the department curriculum requirements, careers related to psychology, graduate school programs related to psychology, and how to apply to graduate school/jobs.

Prerequisite(s): PSY 2012

# PSY 3017 - Experimental Psychology (3 Credits)

DESIGNED AS AN IN-DEPTH EXAMINATION OF THE BASIC PRINCIPLES OF EXPERIMENTAL PSYCHOLOGICAL EVIDENCE; COVERAGE GIVEN TO SPECIFIC AREAS OF SUCH AS LEARNING, PERCEPTION, PHYSIOLOGICAL, SOCIAL, OR COGNITION.

Prerequisite(s): PSY 2012 and PSY 3213 and (STA 2122 or PSY 3205)

## PSY 3205 - Surv. of Analytical Techniques (3 Credits)

Research designs and statistical techniques having the greatest utility for research problems in Psychology.

Prerequisite(s): PSY 2012 and STA 2023 Attribute(s): PSYE - Psych Restric Electives

#### PSY 3213 - Research Methods in Psy & Lab (4 Credits)

Research methods covers the logic of experimental design, research ethics, and analysis of experimentally obtained data. Students will also conduct a research study (design, data collection, and analyses) and report their findings in written form.

Prerequisite(s): PSY 2012 (may be taken concurrently) and (STA 2122 (may be taken concurrently) or PSY 3205 (may be taken concurrently))

Attribute(s): CLWS - Coll Lvl English Lang Writing, CLWS - Coll Lvl English Lang Writing

#### PSY 3832 - Sports Psychology (3 Credits)

The student will become familiar with the field of Sport and Exercise Psychology including a variety of issues related to the psychosocial aspects of behavior in sport and exercise contexts. Topics will include, but are not limited to, the history of the field, personality, self-confidence and motivation, goal orientation, developmental aspects of sport and exercise, attention, anxiety and arousal, mood, goal-setting, imagery, aggression, team and task cohesion, leadership and coaching, injuries and negative aspects of sport and exercise.

Prerequisite(s): PSY 2012

# PSY 4048 - Senior Seminar in Psychology (3 Credits)

Students will learn to consolidate, integrate and apply discipline specific knowledge to issues within Psychology and the Liberal Arts. Previously PSY 4990.

Prerequisite(s): PSY 2012 and PSY 3213 and (STA 2122 or PSY 3205)
Attribute(s): CLWS - Coll Lvl English Lang Writing, CLWS - Coll Lvl English Lang Writing

## PSY 4604 - History & Systems in Psych (3 Credits)

Review of the historical roots of modern psychological theories. In-depth consideration of the various schools of psychology, such as behaviorism, Gestalt, psychoanalysis, and phenomenological psychology.

**Prerequisite(s)**: PSY 2012 and (PSY 3213 or PSY 3017) and (STA 2122 or PSY 3205)

Attribute(s): PSYE - Psych Restric Electives

#### PSY 4913 - Directed Study (1-3 Credits)

STUDENTS ARE GIVEN THE OPPORUNITY TO WORK CLOSELY WITH FACULTY IN RESEARCH OR OTHER SCHOLARLY ACTIVITIES.

Prerequisite(s): PSY 2012 and STA 2023 and (PSY 3017 or PSY 3044)

Attribute(s): PSYE - Psych Restric Electives

# PSY 4930 - Special Topics (1-3 Credits)

Selected topics in Psychology. Course provides an opportunity for study in depth of topics not offered in other courses.

**Prerequisite(s):** PSY 2012 and (PSY 3213 or PSY 3017) and (STA 2122 or PSY 3205)

Attribute(s): PSYE - Psych Restric Electives

## PSY 4940 - Internship in Psychology (3 Credits)

Applied practicum in community service agencies.

Prerequisite(s): PSY 2012 and (PSY 3213 or PSY 3017) and (STA 2122 or

PSY 3205)
