# SPEECH COMMUNICATION (SPC)

#### SPC 1017 - Fundamentals of Communication (3 Credits)

Introduces students to the full range of communication from interpersonal communication and small group communication to public speaking. Students explore fundamental communication concepts and topics and develop skills to put these principles to work. This course includes selections from the Western canon.

Attribute(s): CRIT - GE Critical Think Competency, GE Critical Think Competency, GE Written Comm Competency, GECO - Gen. Ed - Communication, Gen. Ed - Communication, WCOM - GE Written Comm Competency

#### SPC 1608 - Effective Speaking (3 Credits)

Instruction and practice in effective public speaking. Includes practical experience in speech composition, delivery, and critique.

**Attribute(s):** GE Written Comm Competency, GECO - Gen. Ed - Communication, Gen. Ed - Communication, WCOM - GE Written Comm Competency

#### SPC 2023 - Public Speaking (3 Credits)

Introductory course focused on audience-centered public speaking skills, including organization, structure, and clarity in oral presentation.

Attribute(s): GE Written Comm Competency, GECO - Gen. Ed - Communication, Gen. Ed - Communication, WCOM - GE Written Comm Competency

#### SPC 3210 - Theories of Human Communicatio (3 Credits)

Examines human communication theories in a variety of areas including: interpersonal, nonverbal, information processing, verbal, intrapersonal, message production, group and public communication.

#### SPC 3230 - History of Rhetorical Theory (3 Credits)

This course surveys the foundations and historical evolution of major concepts, issues, theorists, and approaches to the study of rhetoric from Plato to recent contemporary theorists.

# SPC 3301 - Interpersonal Communication (3 Credits)

Basic characteristics of the systems and symbolic interaction approaches to interpersonal communication, consideration of interpersonal needs, self disclosure, listening, perception, attraction, and social conflict.

### SPC 3331 - Nonverbal Communications (3 Credits)

Examines nonverbal communication theory and behavior including the areas of kinesics, proxemics, haptics, object language, paralanguage, and chronemics.

#### SPC 3370 - Intrapersonal Communication (3 Credits)

This course examines the conscious and unconscious ways in which humans speak to themselves. It will focus on the becoming conscious of self-talk and the meta-messages that exist within thought processes, as well as communication to and about oneself.

#### SPC 3425 - Group Communication (3 Credits)

Students study small group discussion and problem solving in this course. A basic understanding of theory behind purposeful discussion is taught in addition to providing students with practical experiences participating in or leading small groups.

Prerequisite(s): SPC 1017 or SPC 2023 or SPC 1608

#### SPC 3543 - Ecological Communication (3 Credits)

Theories and practice and activism are examined and are related to environmental movements. Successful environmental persuasive messages and activists strategies will be examined and students will apply concepts to a real environmental cause.

Attribute(s): SUSC - Sustainability Component

#### SPC 3602 - Advanced Public Speaking (3 Credits)

Development of public speaking abilities to become proficient in both the construction and delivery of a speech. Students will be required to deliver speeches both to their classmates as well as in the community.

Prerequisite(s): SPC 2023 or SPC 1017 or SPC 1608

#### SPC 3713 - Japanese Comm & Acculturation (3 Credits)

This course aims to enhance intercultural communication skills, foster appreciation of linguistic and cultural pluralism, and promote understanding of achieving equality in communication. Students learn basic Japanese vocabulary and phrases and studies on intercultural adaptation.

Prerequisite(s): ENC 1102

#### SPC 3721 - Interracial/Intercultural Comm (3 Credits)

Examines interracial and intercultural communication theory and behavior. Explores the effect of race, gender, exceptionality, age, regionality, occupation and education.

Attribute(s): SUSC - Sustainability Component

#### SPC 3722 - Critical Race Theory in Comm (3 Credits)

This course (1) explores communication and the dynamics of racerace, power, privilege, and oppression - primarily in the U.S. context; (2) connects theoretical perspectives from critical race theory, whiteness studies, and the interracial communication to practical perspectives based on students' lived experiences; (3) uses academic texts, personal narratives in literature, and documentary and non-documentary films.

# SPC 4900 - Directed Reading/Ind. Sty (1-6 Credits)

Independent Study

#### SPC 4931 - Special Topics (3 Credits)

Various topics in advanced communication performance. May be repeated for credit with change of topic.

#### SPC 4932 - Senior Seminar (3 Credits)

Culminating seminar in which majors are mentored by faculty in preparation for their capstone projects and future careers.

Prerequisite(s): (SPC 2023 or SPC 1608) and SPC 1017 and SPC 3301 and SPC 3230 and SPC 3721 and COM 3343

## SPC 4941 - Internship (1-6 Credits)

Supervised professional experience in a communication related field. Interns report to and are assessed by a faculty member.

Prerequisite(s): SPC 1017 and SPC 3230 and SPC 3301 and SPC 3721
