

SPANISH LANGUAGE (SPN)

SPN 1120C - Beginning Spanish 1 (4 Credits)

This is the first course in the first-year Spanish sequence and introduces students to the Spanish language. The topics included in the course are Spanish grammar, syntax, and vocabulary. Through the application of the grammar and vocabulary, students are introduced to some of the cultures and peoples of Spanish heritage, including figures from the Western canon. Not open to native or near-native speakers of Spanish.

Attribute(s): FLAN - Foreign Language Degree ExHrs, GECO - Gen. Ed - Communication, Gen. Ed -Communication

SPN 1121C - Beginning Spanish 2 (4 Credits)

This is the second course in the first-year Spanish sequence and introduces students to the Spanish language. The topics included in the course are Spanish grammar, syntax, and vocabulary. Through the application of the grammar and vocabulary, students are introduced to some of the cultures and peoples of Spanish heritage, including figures from the Western canon. Not open to native or near-native speakers of Spanish.

Prerequisite(s): SPN 1120C or (SPN 1120 and SPN 1120L)

Attribute(s): FLAN - Foreign Language Degree ExHrs, GECO - Gen. Ed - Communication, Gen. Ed -Communication

SPN 2032 - Spanish for Health Professions (3 Credits)

This is a communicative approach course for health professionals. Emphasis is on practical application of Spanish (medical vocabulary and communication skills) to effectively treat Spanish speaking patients. The course will also cover the cultural aspects and practices of the Spanish speaking world regarding health issues.

Prerequisite(s): SPN 1121C

SPN 2220C - Intermediate Spanish 1 (4 Credits)

This is the first semester in the second-year (intermediate level) Spanish sequence. The topics included in the course are Spanish grammar, syntax, and vocabulary. Through the application of the grammar and vocabulary, students are introduced to some of the cultures and peoples of Spanish heritage, including figures from the Western canon. Not open to native or near-native speakers of Spanish.

Prerequisite(s): SPN 1121C or (SPN 1121 and SPN 1121L) or SPN 1134C

SPN 2221C - Intermediate Spanish 2 (4 Credits)

This is the second course in the second-year (intermediate level) Spanish sequence. The topics included in the course are Spanish grammar, syntax, and vocabulary. Through the application of the grammar and vocabulary, students are introduced to some of the cultures and peoples of Spanish heritage. Not open to native or near-native speakers of Spanish.

Prerequisite(s): SPN 2220C or (SPN 2220 and SPN 2220L)

SPN 2270 - Study Abroad (1-6 Credits)

An intensive study-travel program in a Spanish-speaking country is the focus of this course.

Prerequisite(s): SPN 1134C or SPN 1120C

Attribute(s): SPAE - Spanish Elective

SPN 2532 - Spanish for Educators (3 Credits)

This course is designed to provide future teachers and other professionals in the education field with Spanish language skills that will help bridge the communication gap with Spanish-speaking students and their families. In addition to authentic conversations and proper written communication, emphasis is placed on receptive skills (listening and reading), vocabulary building, and on Hispanic cultures.

Prerequisite(s): SPN 1121C

SPN 3140 - Intermed Spanish for Business (3 Credits)

This is an intermediate level course oriented to the business world. It prepares students for successful communication in the Spanish-speaking world by building on their existing knowledge and emphasizing practical, real life application of language functions.

Prerequisite(s): SPN 1120C and SPN 1121C

SPN 3300 - Spanish Advanced Writing (3 Credits)

A study of syntax, grammar, vocabulary, and writing is the focus of this course. Prerequisite: Placement Test or SPN 2200 and SPN 2201 with a C or better.

Prerequisite(s): (SPN 2201 and SPN 2201L) or SPN 2221C

SPN 3400 - Conversation and Composition I (3 Credits)

Practice in listening comprehension, speaking, reading and writing is the focus of this course. The class involves reading texts, collateral reading, reports, and discussions of written compositions. Prerequisite: Placement Test, or Instructor's Authorization.

Prerequisite(s): SPN 2221C or (SPN 2201 and SPN 2201L)

Attribute(s): SPAE - Spanish Elective

SPN 3500 - Survey of Span Cult & Civil I (3 Credits)

Introduction to the people, institutions, and culture of Spain, from its origins to the end of the 17th century. Lectures as well as assigned reports and papers are in Spanish.

Prerequisite(s): SPN 2221C

Attribute(s): SPAE - Spanish Elective

SPN 3520 - Latin Amer Cult & Civil I (3 Credits)

Introduction to the people, institutions, cultures, and civilizations of Latin America, from its pre-Columbian origins through the Spanish conquest and colonial period. Lectures as well as assigned reports and papers are in Spanish.

Prerequisite(s): SPN 2221C

Attribute(s): SPAE - Spanish Elective

SPN 3534 - Cinema in Lat. Am. & Spain (3 Credits)

The main goal of this course is to help students gain a deeper understanding of Hispanic culture, particularly the role of cinema in the way Hispanic culture is perceived and (re)defined. Survey of major films and directors from Spain, Latin America, and the U.S. Cover many of the principal countries. Discuss films as cultural, historical, political, & economic products. The course is taught in Spanish.

Prerequisite(s): SPN 2221C

SPN 3956 - Study Abroad Cult. & Lang. (1-6 Credits)

This course is a study abroad in a Spanish speaking country that may incorporate the study of history, culture, literature, and language.

Prerequisite(s): SPN 1120C

SPN 4521 - The Americas: Latino Cult.&Soc (3 Credits)

This course offers a comprehensive view of Latino culture and society in literature, film, and other media sources. This course is taught in Spanish and explores the diversity of the Latino groups and Nations' cultures. Language and traditions will be explored as they are represented in various art forms and media. It may include the causes and consequences of migration and displacement.

Prerequisite(s): SPN 2221C

SPN 4910 - Directed Independent Research (3 Credits)

In this course research projects or certain aspects of research are carried out by one or more students under the supervision of an instructor. The class is intended to help students acquire skills in applying research principles and obtaining practice in rigorous data collection and reporting. The hours and levels may vary. Only for senior Spanish majors. Instructor's Authorization required.

Prerequisite(s): SPN 2221C

Attribute(s): SPAE - Spanish Elective

SPN 4920 - Spanish Symposium (3 Credits)

The course offers special sessions centering around a specific topic that are designed to enhance specific professional skills, including professional portfolio preparation. The topics may vary and are selected on the basis of what is new or currently relevant in the field. The hours and levels may vary. Only for senior Spanish majors. Prerequisite: Instructor's Authorization.

SPN 4940 - Intern Practicum (3 Credits)

Practicum application in professional settings of knowledge is offered in this course. The hours may vary and levels vary within an institution. Internship/Practicum/Clinical Practice hours are not automatically transferable.

Prerequisite(s): SPN 4410

Attribute(s): SPAE - Spanish Elective
