The Bachelor of Arts (B.A.) in Journalism prepares students to report, edit, and present high-quality journalism for a variety of platforms. It emphasizes clear writing, factual accuracy, critical thinking, ethical and legal principles, social consciousness, technological skill, and practical, hands-on reporting and editing experience. Students will develop an awareness of the role of journalism in a democratic society and think critically about emerging issues in journalism and mass media.
