The Bachelor of Arts (B.A.) in Psychology focuses on a variety of content areas, including social, developmental, cognitive, clinical, quantitative, and biological basis of behavior. Students can also receive training in conducting independent research and have the opportunity to participate in applied community practice. The B.A. in Psychology prepares students for a variety of outcomes such as work in mental health and applied areas of psychology, graduate school in applied areas of psychology, graduate school in research focused psychology programs, and other areas of employment and graduate studies.
